The Allen Quantum STR-4 theatre organ...the Walt Strony Signature model - "Wilhelmina"



There are four manuals, with 32 Theatre ranks and 49 Classical (EM Skinner primarily) ranks. My instrument also comes with additional ranks in the form of Allen's Genisys Voices, meaning that the current specification is set at 58 ranks!!

We also heard the magnificent three Manual 54 Stop Classical instrument, made by the Content Organ Company in the Netherlands. It is the largest Content instrument thus far in Australia.

The Music Studio is now complete with a very nice Kawai Grand Piano located in the centre between the two organs.

The chambers for the Allen Theatre Organ are the black shapes behind the instruments, the one on the left is the Main Chamber and the one on the right is the Solo Chamber. The chambers for the classical Content Organ are the narrow speakers against the wall on the left and right behind the instruments.

Simon Ellis then explained the specifications of each organ and invited TOSA Members to have a play.

Cliff Bingham was up first and moved to the Allen organ to play a selection including "The Radetski March", "Perhaps Love" by John Denver and a selection from "Follow the Fleet".



Orion Wurlitzer Update

The Insurance Claim by Canterbury City Council for the water damage to the Solo Chamber of the Wurlitzer at the Orion Centre Theatre has been approved based on information provided by the Organ Builder.

Committee Members recently assisted the Organ Builder to access some parts of the Organ for shipment to the Organ Workshop to commence restoration. By the time you read this edition of TOSA News work will have already commenced on the restoration.

BEGINNINGS:

Continued from August 2022 TOSA News An excerpt from The Encyclopedia of American Theatre Organ Volume 3 by Preston J. Kaufmann

THE UNIT ORCHESTRA FLOUNDERS: September To December 1912

"The National Association of Organists closed its *Resolution of Endorsement* with the words: 'If his genius has free scope, a marked uplift to the musical life of the world will result'."

Yet it seemed more time was spent dealing with problems than sales efforts or boosting production--FW to RHJ in Manhattan, November 11, 1913:"The attached is a copy of a telegram we sent vou today. Mr Kelly [position or affiliation with Wurlitzer unknown] just called me up over the telephone and told me the Style J [Opus 19] in Syracuse was not finished and what we were going to do about it. [It was contracted for \$6,000 less a \$1,000 allowance; the discount may have been given due to the difficulties in getting the organ into operation.] He says that McSpadden left the instrument in an unfinished condition; that it will not repeat the notes and that McSpadden told Kelly's man in Syracuse that he was going to have some special music rolls cut for the Style J that would repeat. This, of course, is rediculous. If McSpadden did say this, he should know better, and what I cannot understand is why McSpadden did not write us if he knew that the instrument was not finished and working properly. Mr. Jones here at the factory states that the instrument worked perfectly when he left.

"Mr. Kelly is under the impression that the instrument hasn't enough wind; that the blower is not large enough, but this hardly seems possible. Perhaps the suction is at fault.

"As you know, it is absolutely necessary that this instrument is in perfect shape by the 15th, and that we make good with it. If we do not, it will come out at the end of two week's time. Furthermore, every day that the instrument is not in use we do not get paid for it. If you think it is necessary to send someone from the factory instead of having McSpadden go up from New York, be sure and wire us. If possible, I think it preferable for you to stop off there so that you are sure that everything is right. Mr. Jones thinks it would be best to have Mr. Marr so that he could see whether the work was done right or wrong. If you want Marr to go, wire us."

RHJ in Manhattan to FW, November 11, 1912: "Regarding Hotel Martinique, [Hotel Manager] Chandler is distinctly hostile to our instrument and makes things as difficult for us as possible. . . . and [hotel manager] Mr. Taylor is most favorable and [organist Archer] Gibson is on the fence--so far we have done well--especially this evening.

"Regarding Syracuse. I am having untold trouble to secure a player [organist]. No one feels it worthwhile to leave present employment for a two week engagement. I turned at last to a Philadelphia pupil, but a wire informs me he cannot leave his present job!

"Dr. Ronfort has to play at Cort, Chicago and I have to keep Century, Statler, Bronx and Martinique going.

 $\$ McQuarrie will be through at Statler on Sunday night--but that is just too late. . .

"The heater not being in [probably referring to Syracuse job] and the place very cold and damp, doubtless something has gone out of adjustment--but I am surprised their man could not fix it. Perhaps I may go instead of him [McSpadden] to fix the trouble and train their own musicians to play our instrument. He is reported to be a good man. I told Murphy to rush that heater-- has he gotten it delivered yet?"

FW to RHJ in Manhattan, November 12, 1912: "This morning to my surprise, Mr. Kelly telephoned me and told me that he had received the following telegram from you: 'Will send McSpadden to Syracuse Wednesday night. Am finding it impossible to secure player. Telephone me Hotel Martinique, New York, Tuesday 1 O'clock. I think I had better meet their own musician in Syracuse Thursday and teach him to play the instrument.'
